Lesson Focus

After Jesus had spent some time in prayer, Judas arrived with a band of soldiers to betray Jesus. The soldiers arrested Jesus and took him before Caiaphas, the high priest. Peter followed Jesus to the courtyard of the high priest, but when asked if he knew Jesus, Peter denied his Lord. When he realized what he had done, he wept over his sin.

What You Heard in the Word

- Jesus knew that Judas planned to betray him, and he went willingly with the soldiers who arrested him. The disciples fled, just as Jesus said would happen.
- Peter boldly tried to protect Jesus in the garden, but Jesus told him to put his sword away. In the courtyard outside the high priest's house, Peter denied the Lord three times then wept over his sin.
